Designed to enhance our ongoing program of work to address today's business environment

The Jefferson County Chamber of Commerce has a wide range of programs that support our mission to be the voice of our members and to promote an environment for growth in our county. In many ways, we run organizations simultaneously—one that delivers networking and business development opportunities and one that brings leaders together to tackle important business and community issues.

In 2017, we will give special emphasis to several key areas:

Small Business Resources

To better position our small businesses for growth and success, it is critical that resources for business development be available. The Jefferson County Chamber will:

- Partner with business development organizations to provide greater access and connections for our small businesses and entrepreneurs.
- More effectively communicate what resources are available to our small business.

Young Professionals

Young professionals in our community currently include individuals that identify as either GenX or Millennials. Learning from young professionals, engaging them in leadership and using their voice to grow our community are key to ensuring our ability to attract and retain talent to our area.

- Encourage contributed participation by young professionals on Chamber committees focused on important issues to young professionals, businesses and our community.

WHAT DOES YOUR MEMBERSHIP SAY TO YOUR CUSTOMERS

A recent study by the Schapiro Group, an Atlanta-based strategic consulting firm, surveyed nearly 2,000 consumers nationally revealed that being active in a local chamber of commerce is an effective business strategy as nearly two-thirds of consumers surveyed believe that such companies use good business practices, are reputable, care about their customers and are involved in their community.

It's no surprise that the Chamber's message aligns with these attributes— to offer a voice to our business community and enhance the quality of life in our county.

The study further added that consumer perception of chamber members are generally positive in many ways:

- When consumers know that a small business is a member of their local chamber chapter, they are **63% more likely to purchase goods or services** from the company in the future.
- Most consumers (59%) believe that being active in the local chamber of commerce is **an effective business strategy overall**.
- Being a chamber of commerce member is **29% more effective in communicating to consumers that a company uses good business practices**.
- Consumers show a **51% increase in awareness** of a small business if it's a chamber of commerce member.

Small businesses are the largest segment of our membership at the Chamber. The study indicates that chamber membership has very consistent and powerful benefits for small business members— *if* the consumer knows that the business is affiliated with the local chamber. We have a number of ways that you can let consumers know that you are a member of the Jefferson County Chamber of Commerce.

Do consumers really support businesses *because* they are chamber members? Put that membership decal in your window and find out!

CHAMBER PROGRAMS

Chamber membership also provides support to a wide variety of endeavors that generally promote an environment conducive to business. These more “tangible” benefits include community-building activities that effectively serve to elevate the quality of life here in Jefferson County.

Three-Star Program

Jefferson County has received the Governor's Three-Star award for 25 years which has allowed the Chamber to develop such programs as Leadership Jefferson County, Youth Leadership Jefferson County and Imagination Library. The Three-Star program is designed as a road map to assist local communities in their effort to achieve excellence in the community and economic development. Participating communities are guided through a comprehensive plan of essential criteria developed by collaboration of various state agencies. These combined efforts have made the Three-Star Program an important component of our Chamber's economic strategy.



The program is designed to help communities take full advantage of economic development opportunities. The goals are to preserve existing employment, create new employment opportunities, increase family income, improve quality of life and create a strong leadership base.



Leadership Jefferson County (Adult)

Leadership Jefferson County is a program of the Jefferson County Chamber of Commerce. It was formed in 1997 from the Chamber's Leadership Development Committee to design, implement and administer a program to meet the leadership needs of Jefferson County. The mission of this program is to develop leaders who will have a positive impact on the growth & development of Jefferson County.

CHAMBER PROGRAMS

Leadership Jefferson County (Youth)

Youth Leadership Jefferson County was established by the Chamber in 1998 as part of its Governor's Three Star Program. It was the class project of the first LEADERSHIP Jefferson County program and the Chamber has served as its presenting sponsor. This accredited class is offered to sophomores and juniors at Jefferson County High School during the spring semester. The class is instructed by Mrs. Brandy Arnold, a LEADERSHIP Jefferson County alumnus. In addition to the rigorous classroom work in a diverse curriculum, the class has outside assignments including required visits to meetings of the County Commission, City Councils, School Board and Planning Commission as well as visit to the State Capitol each year. The program concludes with a graduation ceremony in May for both the students and their families with a dinner and concert.



Dolly Parton's Imagination Library



In Jefferson County, over 1,700 children ages birth through five years of age receive a free book each month through the Imagination Library program.

The county was one of the first to participate in the program, founded by Dolly Parton in 1996 as a gift to the children of her hometown of Sevierville.

The Jefferson County Chamber of Commerce was the initial presenting sponsor for this program. The state and local communities joined as partners in 2004, and to date, Tennessee's statewide program has provided over 15 million books to children without cost to their families. Today, we are also proud partners with the Governor Books from Birth Foundation.

Christmas in Jefferson County

Christmas in Jefferson County is a program that brings together all the resources of the community to provide food and toys to needy families of Jefferson County. The Chamber and Family Resources Center coordinates all of the activities and utilizes businesses, neighborhoods, churches, civic clubs and schools in the county. With help from over 400 volunteers, this program has provided an average of over 650+ families and elderly citizens with Christmas food baskets and nearly 700 children each year receive a bag of toys from the Angel Trees placed throughout the community.



CHAMBER STAFF

In the early 1980's, a group of visionary leaders saw a great need to create a county-wide Chamber of Commerce that serviced the needs of all the municipalities in Jefferson County including Baneberry, Dandridge, Jefferson City, New Market and White Pine.

Today, our Chamber has over 325 members that are focused on one common goal — to make Jefferson County the best possible place to live, work, play and do business. With an eye to the future, the Chamber, its member businesses and the citizens of Jefferson County recently completed a county-wide Strategic Action Plan. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors governs the Jefferson County Chamber of Commerce. The duty of the Board is to shape policy, identify solutions, and implement programs. Members of the Board of Directors are elected by the membership and should be a fair representation of retailers, manufacturing, service providers and other categories of membership. To be eligible for a board seat one must be an owner of the member business, or an employee designated to represent the business.

The Board of Directors is composed of fifteen (15) directors from the membership, five (5) of whom will be elected annually to replace the directors whose regular terms are expiring. Board terms are for a three-year period, or until their successors are elected and qualified. Board terms begin on January 1 of each year. The Chairman can serve a 4th year as Past Chairman as nominated.

Nominations for the Board of Directors are sought in September and these nominations are sent to the membership for approval in October. Additional names can be nominated as candidates by petition only. The petition process is identified in Article IV, Section C of the Chamber by-laws.

Directors responsibilities include (but are not limited to):

- A commitment to a three-year term
- Attendance at Chamber board meetings as called
- Serve in a leadership role
- Serve on one or two additional committees during each year of term
- Participation/attendance at Chamber sponsored events

Board meetings are open to all members. Meetings are held on the third Wednesday of every other month from 8:00 a.m.—9:00 a.m. at Jefferson Memorial Hospital. The date, time and location of meetings are subject to change, as required, with board approval. The dates are posted on the Chamber website or can be confirmed by contacting the Chamber office.

Members are invited to contact the Chamber staff to be scheduled to address the board or to add items to the agenda and should do so one week in advance of the meeting. Board minutes and agenda are kept in accordance with the Chamber by-laws and are available by contacting the Chamber office.
